1. Finish the following dialogue:

A dialogue with THREE (3) deletions is provided (1 stimulus & 2 responses). The topic of the dialogue should be related to the students' everyday life, interests, hobbies, events and so on... The situation in which the dialogue takes place is described briefly but clearly. The students are required to fill in the deletions with the appropriate language forms. The first exchange should be in full. (One mark each)

2. Write what you would say in each of the following situations:

THREE (3) situations are described, briefly but clearly. Students are asked to write what they would say in each situation. (One mark each)

B. Reading Comprehension (5 Marks)

3. Read the following, then answer the questions:

(5 Marks)

A text (unseen in the Set Books) of about one hundred and twenty to one hundred and forty (120-140) words is provided. This can be a short story, a factual text, a table or an email. Most lexical items and structures in the text should be from the Set Books. Students are required to answer THREE (3) open-ended questions and TWO (2) multiple-choice questions with FOUR (4) options each. (One mark each)

These questions must test each the following reading comprehension skills:

- extracting information
- giving the main idea
- understanding reference (pronoun reference)
- guessing the meaning of vocabulary in context
- answering a critical thinking question (giving an opinion, evaluating an idea, etc.)

C. The Reader (7 Marks)

4. a Answer the following questions:

(5 Marks)

Students are asked to answer FIVE (5) open-ended questions. Three are factual questions and two are critical thinking questions. (One mark each)

b Match the items in column a with those in column b:

(2 Marks)

Students are asked to match FOUR (4) items from column A with their corresponding answers in column b. Column b must have FIVE (5) items. The matching items should include elements of literature ONLY not factual questions. These include questions related to setting, characterization and other literary devices included in the Set Books.

D. Usage & Writing (12 Marks)

5. Choose the correct answer from a, b, c or d:

(3 Marks)

SIX (6) varied multiple choice items (3 vocabulary & 3 structure) based on the Set Books are provided. The students are asked to choose the correct answer from the FOUR (4) options given. (Half a mark each)

6. Rewrite the following using the word(s) in brackets to give the same meaning: (1½ Marks)

Students are asked to rewrite THREE (3) varied sentences, using the word(s) in brackets, without changing the meaning of the sentences. The sentences must test structure only. (Half a mark each)

7. Read and correct the underlined words:

(1½ Marks)

THREE (3) separate sentences with THREE (3) vocabulary mistakes are provided. Students are asked to rewrite each sentence correctly. (Half a mark each)

8. Write a paragraph of SIX (6) sentences on:

(6 Marks)

Students are asked to write a paragraph of SIX (6) sentences using the information given in a table, a form, key words, guiding points, instructions or questions.

Write an e-mail to

Students are asked to write an e-mail using the information provided.
