What will man be in the future-in 5000 or even 50,000 years from now? We can only make a guess, of course, we can be sure that he will be different from what he is today. For man is slowly changing all the time.

Let us take an obvious example. Man, even five hundred years ago, was shorter than he is today. Now, on the average, men are about three inches taller, and we assume that they will continue to grow taller. Again, in the modern world we use our brains a great deal. Even so, we still make use of only about 20 % of the brain's capacity *قدرة / سعة*. As time goes on, however, we shall have to use our brains more and more eventually we shall need larger ones! This is likely to bring about a physical change too: the head, in particular the forehead, will grow larger.

But what about hair? This will probably disappear from the body altogether in course of time because it does not serve a useful purpose any longer. In the future, then, both sexes are likely to be bald!

All the same, in spite of all these changes, future man will still have a lot in common with us. He will still be a human being, with thoughts and emotions similar to our own.
